

CHRIST'S BETRAYAL

John 18:1-11

1. John's purpose in writing the gospel: "...these have been written that you may believe that Jesus is the CHRIST, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name." John 20:31
2. Jesus came to earth for one reason: to die, to pay for SIN, all SIN, that people can be reconciled with God.
3. In reading Isaiah we see the purpose of God the Father. We see that God has all knowledge and had a plan for our salvation since BEFORE the creation of the universe.
4. The Garden of Gethsemane was a common meeting place for Jesus and His disciples. Judas KNEW this place well and that Jesus would be found here.
5. The Roman tribune sent 200 to 600 soldiers with the Jewish officers to arrest Jesus, thus preventing an uprising among the people of Jerusalem.
6. In Exodus God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM". When Jesus was being arrested, twice He used the same name for Himself that God used in identifying Himself to Moses. He answered, "I told you that I AM." John 18:6 & 8
7. Peter was emboldened by Jesus' show of authority and power when hundreds of men FELL to the ground at the words "I AM", but he still did not understand that Jesus needed to die for the salvation of those called by God.
8. Jesus is still teaching that He must be obedient to His Father just as the disciples need to be obedient to HIM. And we are to be obedient to Christ.
