

Using A Concordance To Do A Word Study

Luke 19:10 *"For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost."*

1. Pray.
2. Select word or words to study, i.e. *seek, save, lost*
3. Look up selected word in the dictionary. i.e. *seek* - search, try to find, ask for help or advice, to try to get or achieve something
You may also want to search for its antonym.
4. Look up the word according to its spelling and the chapter and verse of the book of the Bible it is used in. Make note of the number assigned to it.
Seek - 2212
5. Using the assigned number, refer to the back of the concordance for the word's use in Hebrew or in Greek. The Old Testament is written in Hebrew and the New Testament in Greek. #2212 in Greek because it comes from Luke which is in the New Testament - *seek after or for*
6. Find verses that have the same usage, i.e. John 7:7, John 7:19, etc. Read them. Don't mix up the Greek and the Hebrew!
7. Paraphrase the Bible verse using the meaning(s) you have discovered.
