Lesson Thirteen - What Will Happen When God's Final Trumpet Sounds (The Feast of Trumpets, the Day of Atonement, and the Feast of Tabernacles)

Following the death of Christ (Passover), His resurrection (Firstfruits), and the coming of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost), God no longer worked through the nation of Israel to reach the world, but rather through the church.

Acts 13:46-49 -

I. The Feast of Trumpets – occurred on the first day of the seventh month, or TISHRI (tish-rah), our October, which began the civil year of the Jews. It corresponds to our New Years Day. One of the main purposes for blowing the trumpets is found in Numbers 10:2. Numbers 10:2 “Make thee two trumpets of silver; of a whole piece shalt thou make them: that thou mayest use them for the calling of the assembly, and for the journeying of the camps.”

A. The trumpets were used for the important purpose of calling God's people together. What will happen when God's trumpet sounds again?

1 Thessalonians 4:16-17 -

1 Corinthians 15:52

B. The trumpets were blown in Israel to gather the people together for worship and war. **Numbers 10:2** "Make thee two trumpets of silver; of a whole piece shalt thou make them: that thou mayest use them for the calling of the assembly, and for the journeying of the camps."

II. The Day of Atonement – Leviticus 23:27 “Also on the tenth day of this seventh month there shall be a day of atonement: it shall be an holy convocation unto you; and ye shall afflict your souls, and offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD.”

The Feast of Trumpets occurred on the first day of the seventh month (Tishri), and the Day of Atonement came on the tenth day of that same month.

A. Two Goats – Leviticus 16:7-10 “And he shall take the two goats, and present them before the LORD at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation. 8 And Aaron shall cast lots upon the two goats; one lot for the LORD, and the other lot for the scapegoat. 9 And Aaron shall bring the goat upon which the LORD'S lot fell, and offer him for a sin offering. 10 But the goat, on which the lot fell to be the scapegoat, shall be presented alive before the LORD, to make an atonement with him, and to let him go for a scapegoat into the wilderness.”

B. The Day of Atonement taught that sin must be judged. What will happen to those who do not accept God's provision for sin? Leviticus 23:29 "For whatsoever soul it be that shall not be afflicted in that same day, he shall be cut off from among his people."

C. The Elect - Romans 5:11; 2 Corinthians 5:18-19;
